

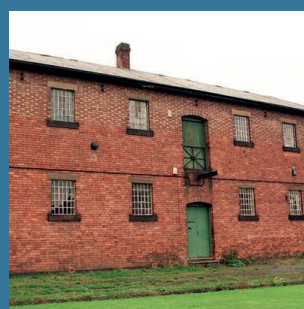
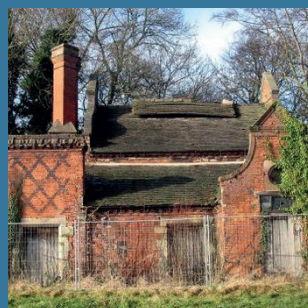
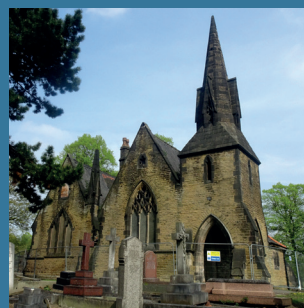
# Join Us

Using their skills and knowledge, members of the Trust identify neglected and abandoned buildings and then work to bring them back into new sustainable use.

DHBT is a non-profit registered charity that is committed to the heritage of Derbyshire; working with its own in-house professionals to provide help and advice to groups and individuals sharing a passion for historic buildings.

DHBT is independent of government and local authorities. It relies entirely on generating its own income through grants, membership fees, commercial activities and donations.

Alternatively you can become a Friend of DHBT for £25/year using our secure online payment facility via our website (our preferred choice).

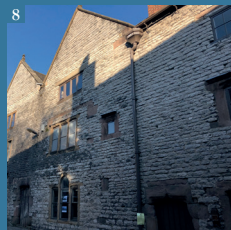
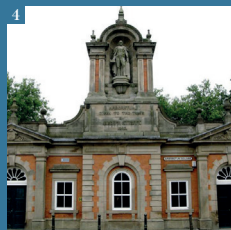
