Barnsley


Barnsley Station, at Cudworth bridge was built and opened by the <u>North</u> <u>Midland Railway</u> in 1840. It was designed by <u>Francis Thompson</u> in a classical style with a rotunda entrance to the platform.

"Omnibus to Barnsley $2^{1/2}$ miles on the left. A flourishing town, with a market on Wednesday, population 12,307."

The North Midland Railway Guide, 1842.

The station was extended with an extra platform in 1885 for the <u>Hull and Barnsley Railway</u>, which passed through but was not connected to the Midland Railway until the 1900s.

It was closed to passengers in 1968.
