Oakenshaw Station for Wakefield

Oakenshaw Station for Wakefield was opened in 1840 by the <u>North Midland</u> <u>Railway</u>. It was a neoclassical design by <u>Francis Thompson</u> with a balustraded roof.

"The building is beautiful. Wakefield, 1¹/₂ miles, regular conveyance by omnibus. Wakefield has a market on Friday, the largest for corn in the north of England."

The station was closed by the <u>Midland Railway</u> in 1870 and replaced by the station at <u>Sandal and Walton</u>.
